As many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believed His name who were born again, not of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

How can we as children of God, rescued from the curse of death and free to live in new life, fail to plead with our heavenly Father daily on behalf of our desperate teens in the confidence of His living word and by the power of His Holy Spirit? No one can come to Jesus unless it is granted him from the Father. No one can be forgiven unless God has granted him a godly sorrow that produces a repentance that leads to salvation. We must pray fervently that God would mercifully pour His Holy Spirit on our teens. Pray that even as the Emmaus road account goes, “their hearts would burn as He speaks to them...as He opens their minds to understand the scriptures” and that they would ask Him to stay! Jesus is the way the truth and the life. We must pray for them to meet Jesus – God will surely to orchestrate all the details.
