August 1 – October 31, 2014

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I've been thinking recently of a true story a friend once shared: "I remember the excitement, as a first-grader, riding the big yellow bus to our country school. Each day we would pick up a family of rowdy boys and their quiet, disheveled sister who was my age. They bound out of the dark, sagging shack, rocking the bus with their fighting and off-colored language and jokes. Under all the grime on her tattered clothes, face and unkempt hair, I could tell that "Charlotte" was a pretty girl. In the small school room shared by the first and second graders, I watched as she recoiled into her desk, dreading the moment the teacher would call on her to read or solve a math problem on the board. Looking back, I wonder if the bruises so often seen on her face and arms, were outward signs of inner scars seared on her heart from abuse. From the first time I saw Charlotte, I had this intense desire to take her home with me. I was sure that if I let her take a bath and put on my clothes, and if she would only let me wash and fix her blonde hair, she would be happy. If I brought her to live in my home with my loving parents, she would be safe; she would smile and come out of her shell. I wanted my loving father, who was 'bigger than life,' to be her father."

Again, I'm reminded of the students for which we've committed to pray. From what sort of poverty (physical or spiritual) do they come every day? What outward wounds or behaviors reveal the scars that are seared on their hearts from abuse and sin? While my friend could not convince her parents to pursue adopting this little girl, we have a Father who promises that "all things are possible" with Him. "When the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son...to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons." In the ancient world, adoption was ordinarily of young adult males of good character to become heirs and maintain the family name for rich people who otherwise had no children. We are reminded over and over again in scripture, that God adopts sinners to become "heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ." "God demonstrated His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are." Jesus, who was crushed and, pierced for us, by whose wounds we are healed, wants us to pray that God will open the eyes of our students, in order to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who are sanctified... Pray that they would be ushered into this blessed adoption soon. He'll wash them, clothe them and feed them!

## Prayer Guide

In this prayer guide you will find a scripture that we will be using in our prayers for our children each day. The major theme for each day is given below.

### **Sunday – Fear of God**

That they will fear the Lord and see His character

### **Monday – Salvation**

That they would know and love Christ as their Savior

### **Tuesday – Wisdom**

That God would give them a heart of wisdom and that they would put on righteousness and know right from wrong

### **Wednesday – Hatred of Sin**

That they would be protected from the evil one. That they would hate sin and be caught when they do sin

### **Thursday – Submission**

That they would respect and submit to the authority over them, and find joy in obedience

### **Friday – Friends**

That they would desire the right friends and be protected from the wrong friends and crowd

### **Saturday – Mate & Purity**

That they and their future mate will be kept pure for marriage
