August 1 – October 31, 2015

As I walked around our local high school track one recent Saturday morning, God unfolded a lesson of life right before my eyes. A personal quarterback trainer was meeting with a father and his son who looked about 12-years-old. (We take football very seriously here in Texas and kids start hitting the field early in life ☺.) The muscular, average-size boy looked fast and confident, wearing all the appropriate practice gear. While the father watched at the side, the trainer and player worked on form and leg work...where to look, where to throw. Over and over the boy threw as the trainer called out instruction. Finally, the son headed for the water cooler while the trainer and father were deep in conversation.

As the father and trainer firmly shook hands, another father and son approached. This gangly player wore glasses and was not as “athletic” looking as the first. Soon the trainer was commenting about the son’s shoes. The son hung his head briefly, but perked up as the trainer patted his back, saying, “let’s get started.” And there it was again, the foot work, the form ...Dad anxiously watching on the sidelines...

I was so encouraged to see the time and resources these dads were spending with their sons. I could have been watching a mom at the ballet studio, or a parent at a music lesson. Parents taking the time to equip their children with life lessons. My prayer that day was that these dads were spending as much time “teaching the law of the Lord diligently to their children when they sat in the house, when they walked by the way...at night...in the morning”(Deut. 6:7) ...that they were spending time in God’s word with their children guided by the Holy Spirit just as intently as they were taking instruction from the trainer. That the sons would be just as prepared for the game of life as they were for the next football game...That the fundamental spiritual attire of honesty and integrity was as important to the dad as the proper shoes were to this trainer.

As we diligently pray for God to change the entire fabric of family life for our students, we can only imagine how He will do that. It could be that we become the answer to our own prayers as we share Jesus with a co-worker. It may be that a Christian teacher or coach shares Jesus with a dad or mom. It may be a believer who who brings an incarcerated parent to the Lord through a prison ministry. It is not for us to say how He will do it, we are to just bring the student to His throne of grace and ask our Heavenly Father “who does not slumber or sleep, to preserve our students from all evil and preserve his/her soul...that God will preserve the student’s coming in and going out from this time forth and forevermore.” (Ps 121:7-8) That our students will one day say, “Blessed be the name of the Lord who has not given me as prey to their teeth...my soul has escaped as a bird from the snare of the fowler...the snare is broken and I have escaped. My help is in the name of the Lord Who made heaven and earth!” (Ps. 124:6-8)
